Mother's Day is a special time for all of us even though it is not commanded in the Word of God. Never-the-less, the day itself causes us to not only reflect upon God's instructions regarding mothers but also the years that have gone by in our lives with our mothers.

The Word of God has somewhat to say about mothers. Mothers love their children (Proverbs 4:3) and are made joyous over their arrival in this world (Proverbs 23:22). Throughout our lives our mothers instruct us in the ways the Lord would have us go (Proverbs 1:8; 2 Timothy 1:5). Moms always see to it that their children get fed breakfast, lunch, and supper (Proverbs 31:15) and that they have proper clothing to wear (Proverbs 31:21). Moms encourage us at moments when we need it the most (2 Timothy 1:5).

Children are taught by example and they watch their mothers closely as they grow older. When we see our mothers working extremely hard, we not only appreciate it but it helps us develop a good work ethic ourselves (Proverbs 31:13, 27). When we experienced their love we were introduced to character traits in a future mate (cf. Ruth 3:11).
