Counseling God

Most of us have taken on the role of counselor in one form or another during our lifetime, whether as friends, coworkers or even parents. Counseling, in the broadest sense, includes many different aspects, among which are listening to identify difficulties, trying to help the individual realize his or her own problems and/or giving advice. However, a problem can arise when we become so confident in our abilities and intelligence that we carry this over into religious matters. In Romans 11:34 Paul wrote, "For who has known the mind of the Lord, or who became His counselor?" We were not given the capability to understand every "in and out" of what God does. So, we are not qualified to give Him counsel. Unfortunately, this does not keep some from trying.

Some try to counsel God regarding how our worship or service to God ought to be. How often do we hear remarks made to justify an action such as, "I don't see anything wrong with it" or "It doesn't say not to do it?" While these comments may be directed toward another person, the counsel is in reality being made toward God. Whenever we find ourselves deciding "Well, I know it says that, but it means this," we need to reevaluate exactly what we mean and whom we think needs to hear it. When we start questioning the wisdom of God's Word, it amounts to an attempt to instruct the Almighty in the way he should have designed Christianity. We may couch it sayings things like, "Times have changed." But it still amounts to giving God counsel he does not need. Others try to act like any time we apply God's Word, it amounts to opinion. This is simply an attempt to skirt the issue and give God counsel. "Whatever you do in word or deed, do all in the name of the Lord Jesus, giving thanks through Him to God the Father" (Colossians 3:17).

Some people go further, saying that God did not tell us all that he intended and that we need. A young lady once told this writer, "The bible is fine as far as it goes. It just doesn't go far enough." What is meant by this statement is that God did not tell us everything. So, we--and He--must rely upon our own revelation. Evidently, people who feel this way have not read Peter's words, "seeing that His divine power has granted to us everything pertaining to life and godliness, through the true knowledge of Him who called us by His own glory and excellence" (2 Peter 1:3). Since God has given all, there is nothing left for men to offer, making those who attempt unwise counselors indeed.
